To celebrate the end of Puanga Elise Goodge will present the unique, ancient and often haunting voices of Aotearoa New Zealand with an introduction to traditional Maori instruments – Taonga Puoro and will be playing some original compositions and soundscapes. Elise began playing and making these instruments in 2004 whilst organising a wananga on Taonga Puoro with the Hau Manu Collective. Under the tutelage of Richard Nunns, Horomona Horo, Warren Warbrick and James Webster and through her work with Te Papa and their Taonga Puoro Group she has come to be a passionate advocate for the revival of these instruments and works to continue the good work of Hau Manu by passing on as much knowledge as she can to anyone interested in learning.
