#### **Liven Chong**

#### Until 23 November

Liven Chong's work navigates a variety of media, from delicate hair embroideries to a cloud of drawings of 'magical ordinary objects' that are embellished with gold leaf. Alongside these are found images from encyclopaedias that are overlaid with mixed media. As well as a series of unique self-portraits that combine painting, performance and photography.

#### Hands-on practical sessions:

Transfer me! -Yr 3+ 90minutes Students learn how to transfer an image onto paper or plywood using a simple technique. Students can either use their own image (we must receive these in advance) or use one of our ready printed ones. These will make beautiful little artworks and fantastic Christmas gifts. Please note this session practical session is available after the exhibition has finished.

#### Whanganui Awa Week -Painting our beautiful Awa!

#### 8 November—16th November Yr 4+ 90minutes

This is the week to celebrate our beautiful Whanganui Awa. Using quality brushes, good paper and tube watercolours students learn the technique of watercolour painting. We will discuss basic watercolour painting techniques and how to create depth in a picture. Students will create a landscape painting focusing on our awa, they will be working from observation, responding to the landscape and colours they see in their environment. The session will be held along the Whanganui River board walk and students will be working on clipboards.
