



Students will gain an understanding of how photography can be used to record places in our community. They will also learn about the type of camera Aberhart uses and explore how a camera obscura works.

An exhibition by Wallace Art Award winning painter James Robinson who was the Sarjeant Gallery's Tylee Cottage artist-in-residence from June-December, 2008. James work is expressive using large amounts of paint, polyurethane, stitched and nailed together canvases. Objects like necklaces, coins, little plastic characters and computer parts appear from underneath the layers of paint. This exhibition provides a good contemporary example of collage.

Primary students can use James as an example to experiment with thick paints and incorporate collage on canvas.
