4 March – 14 May, 2017

The Whanganui Arts Review is an annual event in the Sarjeant Gallery's exhibition programme. This selected exhibition is open to all artists living in the Whanganui region and is an excellent opportunity to see the work of over one hundred artists working in a huge range of media.

Susan Frykberg: It shows really, a rather beautiful spirit

11 February – 21 May, 2017

This exhibition features a sound and moving image work that was created by sound artist and composer Susan Frykberg in response to the life and art of the Whanganui artist Edith Collier (1885-1964). Made in collaboration with video artist, Brit Bunkley, the exhibition also includes a number of wonderful examples of Collier's work. Frykberg was artist-in-residence at Tylee Cottage from September 2016 – February 2017.

Function & Fancy: Decorative arts from the Sarjeant Gallery collection and beyond

28 January – 21 May, 2017

An opportunity to see some wonderful treasures from the Gallery's decorative arts collection ranging from an elaborate 18th Century Meissen porcelain vase to contemporary cast glass. These works are shown alongside items from two local historic homesteads Tōtarapuka in Whanganui East and Lethenty in Bulls. Selected items include ceramics, silverware and glassware and the exhibition is located in our object gallery upstairs at 31 Taupō Quay and at 38 Taupō Quay.

Roberta Thornley: A Serious Girl

27 May – 20 August, 2017

Photographer Roberta Thornley was artist-in-residence at Tylee Cottage in early 2015 and since then she has made Whanganui her permanent base. Continuing her interest in creating narratives with teenagers who are navigating the journey between childhood and adulthood *A Serious Girl* is an exhibition based upon a dedicated Whanganui gymnast.

Euan Macleod: The Painter in the Painting

20 May – 6 August, 2017

Although he has been based in Sydney for more than 30 years, Euan Macleod has constantly returned to the country of his birth, making art and exhibiting here. This touring survey exhibition spans thirty years of his practice and his paintings explore states of youth and aging, the relationship between the human body and environment, and the process of memory and forgetting.

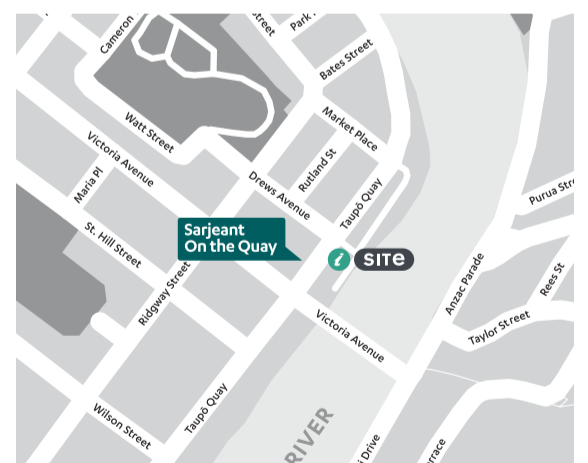
