27 May – 20 August, 2017

Photographer Roberta Thornley's eloquent post-Tylee residency exhibition tells the story of Millie, a young Whanganui gymnast navigating the journey between childhood and adulthood. The resulting body of work floats in the space between endings and beginnings, capturing moments in time.

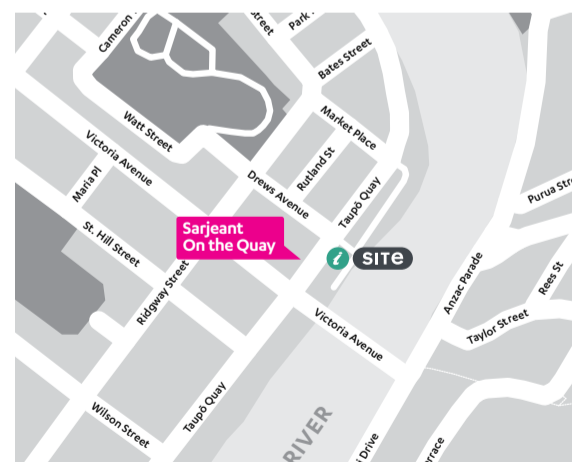
