### Star Gossage He Tangata The People 13th November - 6th February

The exhibition, Star Gossage: He Tangata The People, developed by the New Zealand Portrait Gallery Te Pūkenga Whakaata showcases the immense contribution Star Gossage (Ngāti Wai/ Ngāti Ruanui) has made to New Zealand figurative painting from a kaupapa Māori perspective. Star paints from memory, looking to her environment and her personal experiences to create emotional paintings. They capture the wairua/spirit of the land and the relationship that wahine/woman have with the whenua/land. She is strongly influenced by the colours in the landscape where she lives and the themes which appear repeatedly in her work are those of aroha/love and rangimarie/peace. The figures in her work appear as dreamy and spiritual beings, adding a beauitiful atmosphere to her work that leaves you calmly contemplating their stories.

#### Hands-on practical sessions: **Dreaming** Years 4 - 13

We will view this beautiful exhibition by Star, focusing on how she has used colour and paint before students create their own work back at school. They will learn some simple pastel techniques before creating their own dreamy and ethereal work of their choice.
