Whanganui is currently at the **Red** phase of the COVID-19 Protection Framework. The Whanganui District Council requires that all visitors present a valid COVID-19 My Vaccine Pass before scanning and entering the Sarjeant Gallery. Annie Mackenzie Genuine Article

Annie Mackenzie is a self-taught weaver with a love for natural fibres. During her residency at Tylee Cottage in 2019 she viewed portraits and interior scenes by Edith Collier and Joanna Margaret Paul that featured textiles. From these she has recreated her own woven fabrics, transforming them from paint, bringing them into our physical reality as beautifully woven objects.



While she was in Whanganui she also

researched the history of Wanganui Woollen Mills which was a big producer of many woollen textiles that can be found in lots of

homes across New Zealand. Included in the show are archival photographs that were used for advertising the Mill's fabrics.

Hands-on practical sessions:

Paper Weaving Years 0+

This will be a great little activity for students to try out weaving using strips of coloured paper to create a blanket for their chosen animal which they will draw. Each student will have a sheet that is pre-cut and ready to weave.

This is a great way for students to think about how fabrics are constructed and objects such as kete are woven.

Curriculum links: Visual Arts, Social Sciences, Maths

Branch Weaving Years 4+

Using found stick(s) and wool students will create their own small woven art work. These can be simple or complicated depending on the age level. Curriculum links: Visual Arts, Social Sciences, Maths

Hands-on practical sessions:

Referencing these artists, students will create their own work using paint, markers and stamps.

New photographic work by Whanganui based artist Andrea Gardner. These engaging and colourful photographs use a combination of staged photography and self portraiture. The artist dons costumes, wigs and uses props to create narratives and stories that encourage the viewer to imagine what might be happening.



Hands-on practical sessions:

Get your theatrical groove on. Years 4-8

After exploring the exhibition students will work in small groups to create a theatrical composition using props, fabric and their bodies in front of the camera. Photos will be printed and sent to school. This sessions requires students to use drama and creativity. Curriculum links: Visual Arts, Drama

Artist talk and/or workshop Years 9+

Andrea will talk about her exhibition and her practice followed by an optional workshop where students work in small groups to create their own image. Practical component is weather dependent and will be outside, therefore whole class can partake at one time. Props will be supplied and cameras are available for students that do not have one. Curriculum links: Visual Arts, Drama
