Conditions of Entry

About the Review:

The Pattillo Whanganui Arts Review is an annual community event established to showcase the current creative output from the Whanganui region.

Eligible work:

Any original artwork in any medium, completed in the last twelve months by any artist living and/or working in the Whanganui region or an area that links to the Whanganui River including Whanganui, Ruapehu, Rangitikei and South Taranaki. There is a map viewable online at sarjeant.org.nz/gallery/2025-arts-review/

Entries:

One work per artist. You may enter as an individual or a part of a group, but not as both. Singular multi-part works are accepted but series of works are not.

People's Choice Award:

This will announced Friday 1 August 2025 after counting public votes made at the gallery.

Acceptance of works:

(a) No wet artworks or works that may emit offensive odours will be accepted.

(b) All work will be subject to selection by a panel of three. The decisions of both the panel and the judge are final and no correspondence will be entered into.
(c) The panel comprises a Sarjeant Gallery curator, a locally-based art expert and an external art professional.
(d) Work selected for the 2025 Pattillo Whanganui Arts Review must remain on display for the duration of the exhibition and if purchased will not be available to the buyer until the exhibition ends.

(e) Because of spatial constraints large artworks or installations may not be accepted.

Youth recognition award:

If you are 18 or under on submissions day you are eligible for the Elva Abbot Memorial Youth Award. Please indicate your age and bring ID with you on submissions day.

Entry fee:

\$30 or \$15 for current Friends of the Sarjeant Gallery or students with Student ID. No refunds will be given.

Labelling:

Please write or label the ARTIST NAME, ADDRESS, and TITLE on the back of the artwork. For 3D artworks, please write the information on a swingtag and attach it. For multi-part artworks, all parts must be labelled.

Artist's statement:


These are optional and must be no more then 60 words. They can be submitted in hard copy on submissions day or via email to jessica.kidd@sarjeant.org.nz on Monday 19 May 2025.

Presentation:

(a) Entries must be presented in a manner that facilitates straightforward presentation i.e. framed where appropriate and with D-ring hanging devices (see diagram). If not, works may not be accepted.

(b) All works with an electrical component must be accompanied by a current Safety Certificate from a Master Electrician. Where we have concern as to safety, security, size or other exhibition issues with a specific work this will be discussed with the artist and if the work needs to be withdrawn, the artist will be refunded their entry fee.

(c) Please make sure your work is ready to display safely.(d) If you have any questions about the eligibility of your piece please contact temaari.barham@sarjeant.org.nz



Copyright / Images:

Please be aware artwork received into the exhibition may be photographed by the public or used for promotional purposes by the Gallery.

Receiving date and location:

Artworks must be delivered to Te Whare o Rehua Sarjeant Gallery, 4 Pukenamu Drive, on Monday 19 May, between the hours of 10am – 4pm. Late entries will not be accepted.

Notification:

Entrants will be advised as to the outcome of the selection process on Monday 26 May. Email will be used where possible, otherwise notification will be by post.

Responsibility:

The Gallery will exercise all reasonable care in accordance with industry standards for safety of the artwork while it is with the Gallery however the Gallery does not accept responsibility for any loss, damage or deterioration that may occur, including damage caused by a third party. Artists are responsible for packing and transporting their work to and from the Gallery. Packing materials are to be retained by the artist. Upon submission and collection a condition assessment of the artwork will be agreed upon by Gallery staff and the artist.

Collection of Work:

Collection of work by anyone other than the artist must be authorised in writing by the artist. Unselected artworks must be collected from the gallery on Tuesday 27 May, 10am – 4pm. At the conclusion of the exhibition artworks must be collected on Monday 1 September, 10am – 4pm. The Gallery will not store artworks after this date.
